Used Oil containing >1000 ppm total halogenes is presumed to be a hazardous waste because it has been mixed with halogenated hazardous waste listed in Subpart D of Part 261 of 40 CFR (Subpart D identifies the Hazardous Wastes from non-specific sources – the F Listed Waste Codes, Hazardous Wastes from Specific Sources – the K Listed Waste Codes, and Spill Residues Thereof the P and U Listed Waste Codes). The Generator may rebut this presumption by "demonstrating" that the Used Oil does not contain hazardous waste (for example, by knowledge or using an analytical method from SW-846, Edition III, to show that the Used Oil does not contain a significant concentration of halogenated hazardous constituents listed in Appendix VIII of 40 CFR Part 261).
